MARCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

The Parish Council meeting was held in the Village Hall on Monday 11th March. The Borough Councillor Alistair Beales was in attendance, and we were also pleased to welcome nine parishioners.

At the February meeting, Oliver Locke was co-opted to fill one of the Parish Council vacancies. Three additional candidates were considered for the remaining vacancy, and Mick Wingell, a former Parish Councillor and Chair, was successfully co-opted to join the Council in April. The Council expressed gratitude to all unsuccessful candidates for their applications.

Discussion revolved around the potential installation of protective matting on the village greens to address parking issues and minimise damage. Previous talks with Houghton Estate, the lessor, indicated agreement pending the Council's decision. A working party, comprising of four Councillors and a parishioner, will assess parking options and offer recommendations at the April meeting.

Plans were made for routine maintenance in September to clear drains and outlets along Weasenham Road, aiming to mitigate water levels during heavy rainfall in winter.

The Council also agreed to further support FOSPGM in their work to strengthen parts of the Abbey Road side of Scotsman's Pit. After an extremely wet winter, the current dry weather will allow Scotsman's Pit to return to its expected depth, then FOSPGM will be able enter the pit and inspect the bank closer.
